

EXTENSION OF STATE-TRIBAL GAMING COMPACT  
BETWEEN THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA AND THE  
UNITED KEETOOWAH BAND OF CHEROKEE INDIANS IN OKLAHOMA (SSG)

This Extension of the State-Tribal Gaming Compact is made and entered into this 27<sup>th</sup> day of December, 2019, by and between the State of Oklahoma ("State") and the United Keetoowah Band of Cherokee Indians in Oklahoma ("Tribe"), with respect to the following:

WHEREAS, the State and the Tribe are parties to a certain State-Tribal Gaming Compact ("Compact") dated December 27, 2019; and

WHEREAS, there is a disagreement between the Tribe and the State concerning whether the Compact terminates January 1, 2020, or whether the Compact renews for another 15-year term; and

WHEREAS, the Tribe and State desire to preserve their respective legal arguments regarding that disagreement; and

WHEREAS, the Tribe and the State desire to maintain operations and preserve the status quo under the current Compact until August 31, 2020, while trying to settle their differences;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, the parties agree the term of the Compact as set forth in Part 15B of the Compact shall be extended as follows:

"B. This Compact shall have a term which will expire on August 31, 2020, and at that time, if organization licensees or others are authorized to conduct electronic gaming in any form other than pari-mutuel wagering on live horse racing pursuant to any governmental action of the state or court order following the effective date of this Compact, the Compact shall automatically renew for successive additional fifteen-year terms; provided that, within one hundred eighty (180) days of the expiration of this Compact or any renewal thereof, either the tribe or the state, acting through its Governor, may request to renegotiate the terms of subsections A and E of Part 11 of this Compact."

Miscellaneous.

- a. The parties shall cooperate with each other in good faith in seeking all necessary approvals from the Department of the Interior and the Bureau of Indian Affairs, if deemed necessary;

- b. The parties represent and warrant that each is authorized to execute this Compact extension and that it is the binding obligation of the parties upon execution; and
- c. All other provisions of the Compact shall remain in full force and effect.




